Now I'd heard there was a list of chords

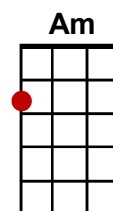
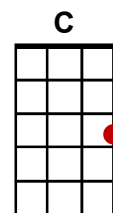
That I should play 'til I got bored

On X-Factor they sang this song

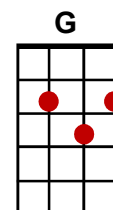
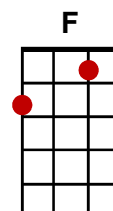
But I believe they got it wrong

It doesn't matter who you are

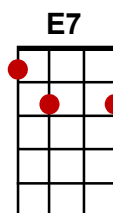
Or where you come from, near or far

No-one will want to be your friend

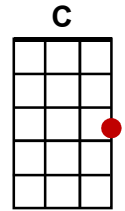
Because you drive them round the bend

Ukulele (Cont'd)

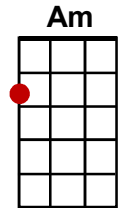
Chorus: **F** **Am** **F** **C G C** **Am C Am**

I'm setting out to tread the boards

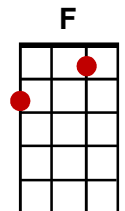
F **G** **C** **G**
